Hail To The Victors

By now almost everyone should know that the Amherst Bulldogs defeated the Milford Bulldogs 72-48 for the 1995 Six-Man State Championship in Sweetwater on December 16th. Just to make sure, here's what happened....

Dewayne Miles had an incredible night, rushing for 420 yards on 27 carries and scoring 9 touchdowns. He started out with five quick touchdown runs of 5, 15, 35, 56, and 68 yards, to lead Amherst to a 38-0 lead.

Facing a third and long, Chris Pendleton appeared to be sacked when he flipped the ball into the air to an open Corey Johnson for a 43 yard td pass.

Pendleton and Johnson connected again for a 17 yard score to close out the half down only 38-16.

The scoring was back and forth in the second half as Miles continued to rack up the scores. He had touchdown rushes of 5, 50, and 40 yards, and also returned a kickoff 54 yards for another.

Milford's Pendleton had a huge night also, completing 19 of 38 passes for 366 yards and 6 touchdowns.

It all came down to Dewayne Miles. Nobody could contain him. He finished with 1685 yards and 40 touchdowns in the playoffs alone. That's a whopping 337 yards and 8 touchdowns a game in crunch time.

Below you will find the 1995 Huntress Report All-State Teams. I would like to congratulate these and many others for their exceptional play this season.

In my mind, Dewayne Miles is the state MVP. His skill, as well as leadership, directed Amherst to back-to-back titles. Dewayne stands 6'2", 220 pounds, runs a 4.6 40, and benches over 400 pounds. His playoff numbers were outrageous. Dewayne narrowly edged out Petey Salaiz, who not only led the Mullin Bulldogs to the quarterfinals, but amassed legendary statistics along the way. Petey rushed for over 10,000 yards during his career, more than any other player in six-man history. I will miss the anticipation of that first sweep Mullin always ran to start their games.

My choice for coach of the year goes to first-year Milford coach Kurt McGrath. Coach McGrath converted the Bulldogs from a tight offense to a deadly spread team. This team could have just folded in a tough district.

The play of the year (that I saw) was the Dewayne Miles (aka Tommy Frazier) run through every member of the Milford defense on his way to a 68 yard touchdown or either of Chris Pendleton's td runs against Panther Creek.
