The Weldon Valley, Colorado Warriors shocked the Mullin Bulldogs, as well as over 7800 fans, Saturday night in Brownwood's Gordon Wood Stadium. The Warriors, led by All-Colorado quarterback Shawn Loos defeated the Bulldogs 58-44 in the what was deemed The Super Bowl of six-man football.

Loos guided a deceptive attack from Weldon Valley that involved a plethora of formations and misdirections that kept the Bulldogs on their heels. One formation included using five players on the line of scrimmage, causing an end or two to reverse towards the backfield.

Weldon Valley relied heavily on its speed. They didn't

have the size to match up with Mullin, but made up for it with quickness. Their largest players were 5'11" and about 185. Loos, along with fellow All-Colorado team members Chuck Thompson and Travis Shaver, were constantly getting past a stunned Mullin defense.

Offensively, Mullin relied heavily on All-American Petey Salaiz, who rushed for over 330 yards and scored four rushing touchdowns. WV coach Jeff Durbin replied gratefully, "I hope we never see that Salaiz kid again". The Bulldogs were also haunted by three costly turnovers. The Warriors committed none.
