Rory Peacock of Woodson had another huge night. Peacock ran the ball 13 times for 133 yards and three touchdowns. He also completed 7 of 10 passes for 110 yards and two more scores, caught three passes for 105 yards and two td's, and returned a fumble 64 yards for a touchdown. He was also in on 13.5 tackles... Morgan's Junior Aviles has been named Waco Tribune-Herald Six-Man Player-of-the-Week for two weeks this season. Aviles had 180 yards rushing on 19 carries and four touchdowns, along a 46-yard pass reception for another score, 17 tackles, and two fumble recoveries in week two vs. Coolidge. In week four vs. Oglesby, Aviles had 136 yards on 12 carries, three touchdowns, 13 tackles, two more fumble recoveries- one for a score. For the season Aviles has 70 tackles, six fumble recoveries-two for scores, and an interception... Morgan teammate's DJ Pinnell and Joe Brookes are also getting into defensive mix. Pinnell has 46 tackles and four fumble recoveries, while Brookes has 53 tackles.... Travis Thompson of Walnut Springs had 106 yards

#6 Zephyr @ #8 Sidney: What many feel to be the battle for the district title in district 11. Sidney will try its air attack against the tough Bulldog defense. Winner has a leg up on title. Sidney shocked Zephyr last year to make playoffs for first time in 29 years. Last season: Sidney 52, Zephyr 42.

#53 Buckholts @ #31 Coolidge: Other than Jonesboro, these two are the likely candidates for the postseason from district 14. Loser must still face the Eagles, while winner must only pass through Oglesby, the Gap, and Aquilla to advance.

#10 Grandfalls-Royalty @ #16 Dell City: Another huge game in district 8. Speed vs. power. Dell City holds the edge in experience, but G-F has already upset quite a few teams this season. Last season: G-R 28, DC 28.

#15 Groom @ #29 Miami: District one starts off with the fight between the top two preseason picks. Follett is still in the mix, but these teams are the top contenders. Both have played Amarillo Christian, but that doesn't tell us much....

#26 Strawn @ #2 Gordon: Big-time tradition between these two towns. Gordon coach Campbell even coached at Strawn. The bridge is back up between the two towns, but Greyhounds shouldn't expect a welcome party. Longhorns are too tough this time around. Last season: Gordon 40, Strawn 30.

#17 Three Way @ #7 Lazbuddie: The Three Way Eagles have been a pleasant surprise this season. With big wins over Groom, Buena Vista, and Wellman they have vaulted into the tough district 3 playoff hunt. Lazbuddie is playing similarly well. The Longhorns are dangerous with Justin St. Clair at the helm. Last season: Three Way 26, Lazbuddie 22.

#42 Trinidad @ #41 Blum: This may a little presumptuous, but I'm giving a playoff berth to Milford. This then means that the Trinidad-Blum game should be for the second spot. Bynum has an outside shot, while Covington is a little further back. Blum seems to be devastated since losing three starters to an attitude problem.

#18 Wellman @ #28 Sands: Is Sands ready to play? Is Sands the team we all expected to make a long playoff run? Here's the first test and it could get painful. Wellman has played well and may be looking for a little revenge from last season's pasting. Last season: Sands 49, Wellman 0.

Obviously winners will have the upper hand to the playoffs, but remember last year in this crazy one when Meadow took an early loss to New Home, only to come on strong and defeat Southland for the district title.
