It's the matchup many have been talking about for weeks. The top-ranked Bulldogs of Mullin against the second-ranked Bulldogs of Milford. Only one thing is for sure: the Bulldogs will win! Both teams come in with unblemished records: Mullin at 12-0 and Milford at 10-0.

The individual matchups pit two fine backs Petey Salaiz and Norman Singleton, who both averaged over 12.5 yards per carry during the regular season. At

quarterback it's Charlie Smith and Chris Pendleton. Smith is a fine blocker as well as passer, while Pendleton is quick and elusive.

Last Friday, Milford showed it was vulnerable, falling quickly behind Richland Springs 10-0. The Coyotes controlled the ball during the first quarter, allowing Milford only six offensive plays. The second quarter was a different story, as Milford rushed ahead 24-18 by half, before creeping in with the 52-32 victory.
