The most exciting play of the year award has to go to Martin Sanchez for his 78 yard kickoff return for a touchdown with no time remaining to lead the Balmorhea Bears to the semifinals. Guthrie had just scored on a 31 yard Seth Morehouse pass to Roy Fuentes with :11 remaining to take a 70-65 lead. On the ensuing kickoff, Guthrie decided to kick deep eventhough

Balmorhea had already run one back for a touchdown earlier in the game.

In another exciting game, the Milford Bulldogs upset then #1 ranked Mullin 32-30 before a packed house in Hamilton. Ricky Cook and Norman Singleton led the way combining for 3 TD's and 246 yards rushing.

The Matchups

**#3 Balmorhea- #5 Amherst  
at Andrews 7:30pm Friday**

It's a battle between contrasting styles, when these two teams meet this weekend. The Balmorhea Bears are speed deamons who have averaged almost 61 points a game during the playoffs. The Amherst Bulldogs are big and strong and play tough smash mouth football.

The Bears have many threats: Martin Sanchez, Ismael Dutchover, Danny Vasquez, Joseph Apodaca, and Michael Mondragon to name just a few. All of these, except Dutchover, are seniors that give this team strong leadership. They put together 460 yards of total offense and scored 71 points last weekend against a tough Guthrie team that had allowed only 156 points this whole season, including playoffs.

The Bulldogs are led by Junior back Dewayne Miles, who rushed for over 1000 yards this season, but he is by no means alone. Torrey Tolbert, Chris Bishop, Brandon Pointer, and Jerry Frausto also pose as threats. The defense has been a wall throughout the playoffs allowing a total of only 34 points. They have also averaged giving up less than 145 yards of total offense per game. Doing this during the regular season is one thing, but during the playoffs is incredible.

So it boils down to the immoveable object and the irresistable force and something has got to give.

**#1 Milford- #2 Zephyr  
at Hamilton 7:30pm Friday**

In this matchup we have contrasting styles, but this time they are on offense. This "Battle of the Bulldogs II", pits Milford with its huge tight running attack against Zephyr, which tends to be more well balanced out of the spread.

Milford comes in off the big win against Mullin in the "Battle of the Bulldogs I". Milford is big with good speed. RB Norman Singleton weighs 200lbs. and rushed for 145 yards last week, including a 38 yard jaunt to seal the victory. RB Ricky Cook weighs in at 236 lbs. and hammered his way to 101 yards rushing and 2 TD's. QB/ K Chris Pendleton has speed and can run or pass when called upon. Louis Essary (260 lbs.) and Lee Houston (170 lbs.) are dangerous on both sides of the ball. There are no tricks here, just hard nosed football.

Zephyr is led by Howdy Byars. Byars has over 3000 yards of total offense to his credit this season and it is split almost evenly between passing and rushing. They will, however, be without field general Jared Long, who suffered a season ending knee injury against Gordon. Byars will not be alone though, as Chad Hatchet, Dusty Miller, and Justin Evans provide the rest of the offensive punch. On the defensive side, Noah Williams, Adam Funderburg, as well as Hatchet and Evans are the keys.
