

**Super Bowl update**

The **Weldon Valley Colorado Warriors**, who beat Mullin 58-44 earlier this season, didn't do too well the remainder of the season. Weldon Valley lost two regular season games. First to Peetz, 44-18, and then to Prairie, 70-68. In the Colorado State Quarterfinals, they lost to Idalia, 51-32.

Peetz defeated Kit Carson, 42-23, on November 18 to win the 1995 Colorado State Championship. It was the first time since 1986 that two undefeated teams had met in the finals.

**Jeff Hill of Westbrook** led all passers this season with some incredible statistics. In 9 regular season games (they had a forfeit from Ira), he was 250 of 411 for 2720 yards with 41 td's and 4 int's. In their playoff loss to Sands, Jeff was 27 of 47 for 384 yards with 3 td's and 3 int's.

**game notes:**

**Mullin** started out to a 38-0 lead against Woodson this past weekend before the Cowboys caught fire and rallied to lose by only 52-45. Mullin's **Petey Salaiz** turned an ankle and played only sparingly during the second half. Petey had 121 yards on 11 carries and 2 td's. That leaves Petey at 10,346 yards for his career.

Woodson's QB **Rory Peacock** was still unable to throw the football, so the Cowboys moved him to receiver and

**Pete Miller** to spread back. This paid off in the second half as Miller rushed the ball 20 times for 225 yards and 2 td's and was 11-18 passing for 144 yards and 3td's. Peacock caught 9 passes for 132 yards and 2 td's.

**Chris Arizmendez of Klondike** had 26 carries for 216 yards with 5 td's rushing and 1 catch for a td. **Tanner Ethridge** had another solid night. Tanner rushed 11 times for 110 yards and was 8 of 15 passing for 99 yards. He also ran a kickoff back 67 yards for a score.

Milford's **Chris Pendleton** had another huge night. Chris rushed for 72 yards, passed for 252 yards, returned a KO 75 yards for a td, and had 2 int's on defense. Teammate **Keith Washington** returned an int for a score. **Kinta Cook** had 4 rushing td's.

**Brandon Rodgers** of Whitharral rushed 10 times for 124 yards and 4td's. He has 16 td's in his last 3 football games. His teammate, **Cameron Dockery**, caused a fumble, recovered a fumble, intercepted a pass and had 9 tackles in only one half of play.

**Trey Sykes** of Panther Creek had 229 yards on 26 carries Friday night.

Balmorhea's **Junior Dutchover** had 11 carries for 73 yards and 2 td's rushing and caught 4 passes for 104 yards and 2 td's. He also had 6 KO returns for 180 yards and another td.

**Dewayne Miles** of Amherst had a huge night. Dewayne rushed the ball 33 times for a career-high 394 yards and 8 td's. He also returned a KO 58 yards for a td.
