Dewayne Miles of Amherst continues to roll up the numbers in the playoffs. Dewayne rushed the ball **33** times for **294** yards and **8** touchdowns. He has now scored **24** td's in three playoff games.

In the same game, **Delynn Reed** of Sands had an exceptional game passing against the Amherst defense. Delynn was **26** of **46** for **406** yards through the air and **3** touchdowns. His teammate, **Dallas Hopper**, had **9** receptions for **142** yards and a score. **Justin Hambrick** also had **8** receptions for **123** yards.

Klondike's **Tanner Ethridge** led the Cougars with a **5** yard touchdown pass to **Clayton Roberts**, with only **17** seconds remaining, to grab the victory. Ethridge rushed the ball **13** times for **105** yards. He was also **17** of **25** passing, for **232** yards and **4** touchdowns.

Brandon Rodgers of Whitharral carried the ball **19** times for **178** yards. This left the junior back with just under **1600** yards for the season. **Cameron Dockery** had **14** tackles against Klondike. Cameron finishes the season with **143** tackles.

Panther Creek continued its running barrage against Gordon. **Trey Sykes** rushed for **147** yards on **17** carries and **3** touchdowns. He also returned a kickoff **70** yards for a touchdown. **Luis Dellagadillo** ran it **11** times for **124** yards and a couple of scores. The Panthers also came up with some big plays. **Cody Crye** blocked a punt and **Miguel Guiljosa** recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown.

The **Gordon Longhorns** had an excellent season and do not lose a single player for next season. Look for these guys to be back next year.

Milford's **Chris Pendleton** had a terrific game despite playing most of the second half without part of his lip. Chris required **6-8** stitches to put his lip back together. He had **174** yards through the air and rushed for another **95** yards.

Mullin's **Petey Salaiz** ended one of the most successful six-man careers in history Friday night. Petey had **122** yards on **26** carries. This was despite being hampered by a bad ankle.

In the preseason, not many expected to see these two teams make it to this game, however tradition prevailed. Panther Creek was a preseason number 33, while Milford was getting a new coach and came in at number 10.

They have both been here before. Panther Creek won back-to-back titles in 92 and 93, while Milford won back-to-back titles in 1979 and 80, and lost in the title game last season.

Panther Creek comes in on a tear, having won their last 10 games. The Panthers are averaging 79 points per game in the playoffs.

Transfer Trey Sykes has added a new dimension to this team that started the season 0-3, giving them the luxury of 3 quality backs, including Luis Dellagadillo and Cory Crye.

Milford is doing it with Chris Pendleton running the offensive show with Kinta Cook. They run out of both basic formations, but are more effective in the spread, where Chris can utilize his speed. Defensively, Henry Coleman is a monster. He is extremely quick to the ball.
