Battle of the Bulldogs II

Once again the eyes of the six-man world will be focused on the Bulldogs from Amherst and Milford.

I'm not a big fan of sequels, but this rematch should be a thriller. It should also be a completely different style game than last year's championship.

Last year, a sign read, "the spread is dead". Well, it's alive and well at Milford this time around behind the wizardry of Chris Pendleton. Pendleton dazzled the crowd in Hamilton last Friday night with two electrifying touchdown runs. Kinta Cook, younger brother of Ricky Cook, will be the primary ball carrier out of the backfield.

The defense is led by probable all-stater, Henry

Coleman, who seems to have a nose for the ball. Also leading the defensive charge are Jackie Winchester and Pendleton.

Amherst will again rely on its workhorse and all-world running back Dwayne Miles. Miles has carried these Bulldogs back to the title game, having huge nights in the playoffs.

Miles also leads the team on defense, but he is not alone. Brandon Pointer, Tommy Traylor, and Jeremy Jenning are superb athletes, who helped anchor the #2 ranked scoring defense in the state.

Quick Notes:

Both teams colors' are Blue and White and are nicknamed the Bulldogs.

Milford's lone loss came to Covington, 30-29. Covington finished at 9-1 and did not make the playoffs because they lost a coin flip to Trinidad and Milford.

In four playoff games, Dwayne Miles has rushed for 1265 yards and scored 31 touchdowns.

Milford had not defeated a playoff team until they reached the playoffs.

Amherst has averaged 72 points a game during the playoffs, while Milford held Panther Creek, who was averaging 79 a game, to only 6 points last weekend.

This is only Amherst's third trip to the six-man playoffs. They lost to Ropes in the first round two years ago and won it all last year.

This is Milford's fourth trip to the championship game. In 1979 they beat Cotton Center 53-34, in '80 they beat Highland 38-16, and they lost to Amherst last fall.

Milford is one of only 5 six-man schools east of I-35.

Semifinal Results

Amherst 79, Klondike 34

Milford 29, Panther Creek 6

After trailing 28-27 at halftime, the Amherst Bulldogs came alive in the second half of this semifinal.

They took the lead for good on a pass from QB Ryan McNabb to Jeremy Jennings. Klondike quickly responded with a score to cut the Amherst lead to 35-34, with 7:34 left to go in the third.

Amherst then exploded, scoring 44 unanswered points in the next 12 minutes to close out the game.

Dwayne Miles led the Bulldogs in scoring as usual, with seven touchdowns, five rushing and two on kickoff returns. Miles also had 267 yards on 20 carries.

Amherst runs its unbeaten streak to 22 games, the longest such streak of any division in Texas.

Milford's defense kept a strong Panther Creek rushing attack out of the endzone for most of the night, allowing only a last minute score. Panther Creek did rush for over 220 yards behind backs Luis Dellagadillo, Trey Sykes, and Cory Crye, who all had around 70 yards rushing.

Milford's Kinta Cook had 105 yards rushing on 13 carries and two touchdowns, but it was Chris Pendleton who brought the crowd to their feet with two electrifying runs.

Leading 15-0 in the first half, Pendleton appeared to be sacked for a big loss, but he broke free and danced downfield for a score. In the second half, Pendleton again alluded the defense and darted off on another touchdown run.
