Mullin is also slated to play the top team from Colorado, Weldon Valley. This game, on September 16th in Brownwood's Gordon Wood Stadium, looks to break the all-time six-man attendance record.

What about the **Covington** Owls? New coach CW Williams, who led Zephyr to the state semifinals, brings his wide-open offense east and places it into the hands of

mercurial Blue Willis.

Klondike and Tanner Ethridge look to unseat Amherst out west. They should make a run for the title out of the tough district 5 along with Wellman, Sands, and even Grady, but only two can make the playoffs.

We can't leave out **Chillicothe** and the Kendrick brothers, or **Woodson, Loraine** (Bulldogs), and **Milford** (Bulldogs).
