Upsets, surprises, blowouts, squeakers, fumbles, and crushing hits.

That's what transpired this weekend as the 1996 football season got underway.

The season really started on August 30, when the Grandfalls-Royalty Cowboys upset the Lake Arthur, New Mexico Panthers 34-32.

The Panthers are the top-ranked team in New Mexico and were ranked #12 nationally in one poll.

Trailing 32-26, the Cowboys scored on a two-play drive with less than a minute left in the game. Corey Moore hit Jon Richardson on a 35-yard touchdown pass for the game-winner.

Grandfalls didn't stop there.

The Cowboys followed it up with an upset over then #4-ranked Sands this past Friday, 52-20.

Other upsets this week include former

#21 Westbrook crushing then #11 Blackwell, 47-2 and former #26 Samnorwood defeating then #17 Guthrie, 48-12.

Panther Creek got off to a quick start with a 60-12 win over the Cherokee Indians. The Panthers combined for 410 yards rushing.

The new six-man schools had some mixed success.

Fort Elliott toppled the Miami JV, 43-14. Sanderson stopped El Paso Faith Christian, 21-6.

The Eagles only allowed an opening kickoff return for a touchdown before shutting Lions down.

Groom also returned to six-man with a bang, shutting out Amarillo Christian, 45-0.

Blum and Hedley were both given rude welcomes though.

Blum was shocked, 66-34, by the Coolidge Yellowjackets, while Hedley fell to Higgins 44-18.

Friday Night Heroes

Panther Creek's Luis Delgadillo ran for 148 yards on 12 carries. Trey Sykes added 144 yards on only 10 carries and Stephen Loyd rushed nine times for 69 yards.... The Sanderson defense held EP Faith Christian to an amazing -18 yards of rushing. They only gave up 86 yards passing. Preseason All-State center Roy Cash is leading the defensive charge. Cash is now playing end on both sides of the ball.... Balmorhea put up 43 points in the first quarter against Marathon.... Sidney's Craig Steele ran for 239 yards on 18 carries and two touchdowns, while completing 10 of 16 passes for 169 yards and another td... Buckholts' Gary Talafuse ran for 260 yards on 32 carries and four touchdowns, including a 48-yarder. Alan Marek also had 10 solo tackles and 7 assists... Gustine's James Humpries ran for 210 yards on 21 carries and three touchdowns, while Chris Grimes rushed for 181 yards on 16 carries and three touchdowns.... Grandfalls' Roy Vasquez ran eight times for 108 yards and two scores against Sands and 13 times for 158 yards and three touchdowns... In a squeaker, Three Way scored with five seconds left to defeat Buena Vista, but BV's QB, Josh Graham went 14 of 23 for 302 yards passing and five touchdowns... Woodson's Rory Peacock rushed 13 times for 196 yards and four touchdowns and completed 6 of 8 passes for 118 yards passing and three more td's. He also had an interception and a fumble recovery... Highland's Cody Muncy has a separated shoulder and may return this weekend.
